- Students who start from Semester 2 or above should take the Non-beginner Placement Exam (NPE) at the enrollment. The result of NPE will be the key factor to decide which level students can start from.
- The application fee is non-refundable, all the application materials collected by DHU will not be returned.

Elective Courses

General Knowledge: Chinese Calligraphy and Painting, Business English, Humanity and Geography of China, Chinese Folklore, Comparison of Sino-Western Cultures, etc. **Basic Subjects:** Mandarin Pronunciation, Shanghai Dialect, The Culture of Chinese Characters, Newspaper Reading, Advanced Oral Chinese, HSK Tutorial, Ancient Chinese, Translation Practice, etc.

Business Related: Chinese Business Culture, International Trade Practice, Introduction to Economics, Economic Law, Management Case Studies, etc.



Up-grading

The students who have obtained all the required credits and passed the required HSK level can advance to the next grade: from Semester 3 to Semester 4, one must acquire HSK level 4; from Semester 5 to Semester 6, one must acquire HSK level 5. Those who fail the make-up tests of two or more compulsory courses in one semester are not allowed to advance to the next grade.



Graduation

Students who have obtained 155 credits, completed the internship, passed the dissertation oral defense and received HSK 6 or BCT 5 will be authorized to graduate and issued Bachelor Degree of Arts.

* The distribution of 155 credits is: 120 for compulsory courses, 22 for elective courses, 2 for Practicum, 11 for essay, dissertation and internship.

SCHOLARSHIPS

- Each year, excellent candidates will be reviewed and awarded *Outstanding International Student Scholarships*. It covers a partial tuition waiver which varies from CNY 2000 to CNY 6000.
- Each year, Chinese Government Scholarships also subsidize a certain number of enrolled undergraduates.
